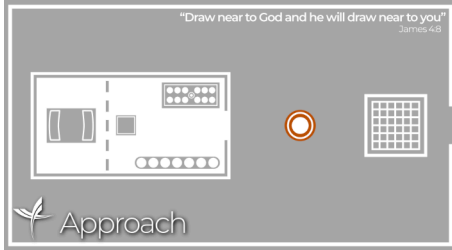

2 Corinthians 5:14-7:1

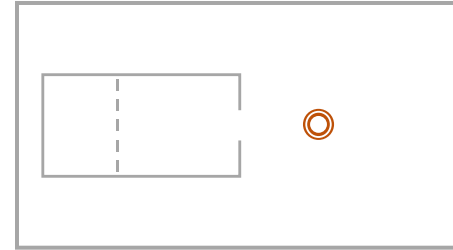
